

"Children of the Promise"

Zechariah had a difficult job. He had to deliver difficult oracles from God. Now that the people had returned from exile and were back in Jerusalem, they faced the arduous work of rebuilding the Temple. There would be many hardships during the process, and even more obstacles in the future. As they grieve the loss of their loved ones, and begin this work, their grief will serve as a remedy, a penance to heal them and to purify them from sin and uncleanness. Thus purified, the people will be ready to receive the Messiah.

We believe the prophecy of Zechariah to be fulfilled in Jesus, the Messiah, who had to endure suffering and death on a cross. By being baptized into his death, we are called to take up his cross and follow in his steps, and to seek the God for whom we all yearn.
