An Update On Our Progress

Now that we are midway in the year, the St. Vincent de Paul Conference offers parishioners this timely update.



Contributions from January to June amount to \$22,342.55 and include 1) a twinning donation of \$3500 from Holy Trinity Catholic Church, and 2) \$1300 in fundraising by The Knights of Columbus and the Council of Catholic Women.

\$18,703 was spent in client assistance: 65%, or \$12,153, for utilities (COL, Diverse. Power, COH, etc.); 23%, or \$4309, for rental assistance; and 7% for food pantry purchases and Kroger cards.

182 individuals were helped, not including food assistance. By these statistics you can see that your generous Second Collection contributions have benefitted many of our community who are on the fringes of our society. May God continue to bless you for all you do in support of this busy ministry.

Looking at the Mass

Why do we genuflect (kneel) at Mass? This gesture of bending on your right knee to the ground is a sign of reverence or adoration. Another outward sign is the triple Sign of the Cross. In attending funerals at St. Peter's, non-Catholics have asked why we do the triple Sign of the Cross before the Gospel. Typically the thumb traces the forehead, lips and heart as people pray inaudibly that their minds and hearts be open to hear the Gospel and their lips open to proclaim it.



Youth Summer Retreat

On Friday, July 8th, ten of our teenage girls will depart for their annual Life Teen weekend Summer retreat to Steubenville, Atlanta.
