Open Registration Underway

Registration for St. Peter's Parish Religious Education Program begins this weekend in the papal hallway after all Masses. If your children attended PREP classes last year we will have pre-printed registration forms available that include much of your registration information. This will save you time during the registration process. The cost for our Parish Religious Education Program remains unchanged at \$35 for one child, \$70 for two children, and a maximum of \$100 per family.

If your child is due to receive the Sacraments of First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion this year, or the Sacrament of Confirmation next year, there is an additional fee of \$50 per child to cover the cost of books and materials. We Take a Look at Social Justice

As promised in last weekend's parish bulletin, we will begin this week to look at the subject of social justice, living Christ's message of love, and begin to explore what the Church teaches about social justice.
